Water dispensers are installed on all guest-room floors to minimise the use of single-use plastic bottles that are typically placed in hotel rooms.

“It is estimated that at least half a million used plastic water bottles are discarded per hotel per year,” noted Loo.

“The installation of water dispensers thus not only contributes to reducing our hotels' negative impact on the environment, but will also result in savings.

“We will be implementing this system as well as other sustainable initiatives across the St Giles hotels portfolio as part of our #CITIZENG sustainable programme,” he added.
